

Every night, Ron and I sing to Maya and Eli (who are three) as we tuck them in. Our family repertoire for bed-time ranges from classic American folk to Israeli to Sesame Street to Reform Jewish to Yiddish. There are certain songs they ask for on a regular basis. One of their favorites is "Tumba La Laila," which Ron usually sings in Yiddish. Typically, our kids would sing along only for the chorus.

A few nights ago, we noticed that they sang just about every word of every verse in Yiddish. Tears flowed from our hearts, as it really touched us.

Ron turned to me and said, "Who else is able to still sing in Yiddish today?" It was a triumphant moment - but one tinged with melancholy, as we mourn a memory.



ECC & RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Talking to Your Children about Anti-Semitism

Let's face it, no one wants to have to tell their child that there are bad people in the world who will try to hurt them just for being themselves. Discussing antisemitism with young children can be challenging. If your kids hear about events on the news, they may have big questions and need extra emotional support.

Research shows that one of the best ways that we can help prepare our children to cope with discrimination and intolerance is by being open about it. When we show our children that these topics, though tough, are not taboo, we let them know that they can always come to us with questions or thoughts about life's scary situations. As parents, we instinctively want to protect our kids from the darker sides of humanity—like antisemitism. But if we don't have these clarifying conversations with our kids, particularly around challenging topics in the news, they will fill in the gaps from their peers and with their own imagination. Our job is to provide accurate, ageappropriate information in a calm way—while reassuring them that they are safe and loved.

Give kids space to share and express their feelings without judgment. Ask them what they heard, how they feel about a headline, and what they think it means. If you notice them relaying misinformation, remain factual and correct the information presented.

Not talking about discrimination is a privilege we want our kids to live in their happy little bubbles where they think unicorns are real. Parents often struggle with issues like racism and antisemitism because they are complex and uncomfortable to talk about. None of us want to tell a child that some people are attacked or hurt simply for who they are or what they believe, Parents may want to preserve a child's innocence and protect them from the knowledge that very bad things can happen in this world. It is important that all children be taught about racism and discrimination so they feel empowered to make a change.

Children and teens feel safer and better able to manage difficult situations when they have a clear plan in place such as what to say and whom to tell. When discussing antisemitism it is important to tell your child that if someone ever tries to be hurtful to them because they are Jewish, it is very important that they tell you or tell an adult they trust We will do all that we can to be sure they feel safe. The most important thing we as parents can do is raise our kids to be good people, and mensches, to help and accept others, and to do the best they

can to treat those around them fairly and with respect.



Even though we are in a drought, we need to deep water our trees to keep them healthy and able to resist diseases. Mature trees are important for:

- Cooling urban heat islands (asphalt is >40 hotter than the outside temperature)
- Providing shade
- Saving energy
- Cleaning the air (removing dust, absorbing pollutants) and releasing oxygen
- Absorbing and storing carbon dioxide
- Beautifying our neighborhoods

Remember: During the drought, you can forget about watering lawns and ornamentals but






