Dear all,

Tu B'Shevat (literally: the "I5th of the Hebrew month of Shevat) is Jewish Arbor Day - the time we celebrate trees, nature, and environmental responsibility. We learn to plant seeds for future generations. And we remember that in generations past, incredible people dug deep so that we could enjoy the fruits of their dreams.

I think especially on Tu B'Shevat about my grandparents, may they all rest in peace. I think about their life journeys. I reflect on the sacrifices they made, the summits they reached, and the lessons they taught. I remember the stories they shared. And I wonder, "If I could have one more conversation with them, what would I ask?"

Unfortunately, I'm not able to have those conversations - at least in person (though their wisdom does continue to guide me). But the questions I would pose ... I encourage you to ask them of those you love. These questions can give us a window into their hearts and souls. Further, these questions can inspire us to live more deeply and more fully ourselves.

And just as there are Four Questions on Passover, there are Four Questions for Tu B'Shevat:

- I) What are you most proud of?
- 2) Do you have any regrets?
- 3) What do you want your legacy to be?
- 4) Who do you wish you could ask one more question of?

In addition to these four questions, what else would you ask?

I only have one additional question, and this is for all those reading.... You know the person you want to go talk with. So What are you waiting for? With love and shalom,

President's Message

Miracles Do Happen at Temple Akiba

We all know that homelessness is at crisis levels throughout Culver City, Los Angeles County and across the United States. Many of us assume that homelessness only happens to those outside our community and not to us.

Our Tikkun Olam Committee, chaired by Cathy Penso, recently co-sponsored a Forum on Homelessness and Housing with the Culver City Area Interfaith Alliance. During the question and answer period, a longtime member of TA stood up and announced that he and his wife were on the verge of homelessness. This was a call to action to Cathy, our Committee and our Temple community to try to help solve this problem. With the help and hard work of the Culver City Housing office and the St. Joseph Center, the eviction process was stopped and our Temple Akiba members did not become homeless. The "rapid rehousing program," an intervention designed to help families that don't need intensive and ongoing supports to quickly exit homelessness and return to permanent housing, was used.

To me, this is a true miracle at Temple Akiba. It shows that we are a community that cares for and helps each other. I am also very proud of our Caring Community Program and Good & Welfare Program where members of our community are reached out to in times of need.

Our caring also extends to outside our Temple walls with programs like our Forums on Homelessness, Mitzvah Day, Shoes for the Homeless collection, Sova collection and much more.

Getting to know each other, developing friendships and doing activities together is a way to strengthen our community and bring us closer to each other. Being a strong and connected community can help us to make more miracles happen at Temple Akiba every single day.

Thank you to our excellent Board leaders such as Cathy Penso for your vision and to our wonderful

Rabbi Zach Shapiro and Cantor Lonee Frailich for teaching us wisdom from the Torah and the importance of community.

ECC & Religious School

I recently returned from the URJ (Union for Reform Judaism) Biennial in Chicago. In attendance were over 6000 Reform Jews from the U.S. and Canada including clergy, educators, lay leaders, members of the Women of Reform Judaism and over 200 NFTY teenagers. Over the course of the week, I heard the leaders of our movement speak about what the Reform movement has done and is continuing to do for Jews around the world each and every day.

The Religious Action Center, a part of the URJ, renewed its commitment to Social Action and Tikkun Olam. It is a shining example of how Reform Judaism and Jews of the Reform Movement continually stand up for what is just and right, not just in terms of Jewish values but human values. The Brit Olam, covenant with our world, is the way that Reform Jewish communities are working together to make change.

I studied with educators and lay leaders from across the country discussing tools to engage families with young children and ways to integrate families into synagogue life. We focused on creating programing for a 21st century community that sparks lives of meaning and purpose. What is the purpose of engagement? How do all of us -- boards, clergy, staff, and congregants -- become better at building relationships that lead to meaningful lives and transformative communities? What do we need in our toolboxes to be successful?

I felt proud to be a part of a movement that not only affirms values Jewish values but lives by them. And how do I know this? Because in between all the speakers of the conference, I had the chance to meet with other educators and youth workers from across the country who share my vision, our vision, one vision of the reform movement.

At Temple Akiba I am proud to say we have long understood the meaning of what it means to be committed to our youth and our congregation. I thank the Board of Directors for their continued support of our youth programs in the past, currently, and as we go forward together. I am proud to be a part of the Reform Movement campaign for Youth Engagement and to partner with a Temple that fully understands what the youth of our Temple can bring to the future of our movement.

I am looking forward to the next Biennial in San Diego in 2021. I hope many of you will consider joining me.
