Dear all,

"It's a perfect day for weeding" Ron said to me the other day. Sigh, I wanted to go out for a

bike ride, but Ron had a look that told me I had better stick around.

I thought deeply about this time of year and garden work.

The first (non-Shabbat) holiday that occurs in the secular year is Tu B'Shvat, the "New Year of the Trees." We learn about the significance of agriculture, and we strive to appreciate the many varieties of fruits in Israel and around the world. Most important, we plant seeds so that the next generation will enjoy the world just as much.

I think of the seeds my parents planted for me. And I believe these are the seeds that you all enjoy as well:

The seeds of love. The seeds of justice. The seeds of education. The seeds of memory. The seeds of responsibility. The seeds of gratitude.

Our world is complicated right now as we continue to face the realities that October 7 unleashed. There are people who have planted weeds rather than flowers, attempting to suffocate our world with narrow thinking. Each and every person has potential for holiness. But some minds have been taken over by weeds.

My mom taught me at a young age how to extricate a weed to its root, without compromising the garden.

And Ron reminded me that the process of weeding is ongoing.

So we continue to plant and cultivate and prune. We do what we can get as close to the Garden of Eden once again.

Keep on planting those seeds of goodness. And do what you can to replace the weeds with nourishing truth.

#### Cantor's Corner

"Am-eh am-eh am-eh Yis-ra-el-eh chai Am-eh am-eh am-eh Yis-ra-el-eh chai oh--od-eh A-vi-nu chai O--oh--od-eh A-vi-nu chai"



Translation: The Jewish people lives! Our God yet lives!

*Am Yisrael Chai* is a Jewish solidarity anthem, a widely used expression of Jewish peoplehood, & an affirmation of the continuity of the Jewish people.

The earliest documented uses were in the aftermath of the liberation of concentration camps during the Holocaust. A recording by the BBC radio service's Patrick Walker captured a chaplain proclaiming "Am Yisrael chai!, the children of Israel still liveth" after singing Hatikvah at the conclusion of a Friday evening Shabbat prayer service led by British Army chaplain Rabbi Leslie Hardman at the recentlyliberated Bergen-Belsen concentration camp on April 20, 1945.

The phrase gained popularity during the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry, when Jewish songwriter Shlomo Carlebach composed the song for the movement's 1965 solidarity rally in New York City. The Forward has placed "Am Yisrael Chai" second only to Hatikvah, the national anthem of Israel, as "an anthem of the Jewish people".

The version of the song at the top of this article might look slightly different than the version that most people recognize. Noam Katz, our upcoming Artist in Residence composed an exciting and dynamic variation of the song in Luganda, a dialect of Uganda. In Luganda, a vowel sound is often added to the end of words that normally end in a consonant. The Abayudaya have adopted this speech pattern in their pronunciation of modern Hebrew. This song reflects that melding of two cultures, two languages interacting with each other to reveal one universal message—that the strength of God and the Jewish people will live on forever.

Noam Katz will be joining us January 19 – 21. He is one of the most exciting voices in contemporary Jewish music. He has shared his high-flying energy & soulful melodies with Jewish and interfaith audiences throughout North America, Africa & Israel. A longtime songleader at URJ Eisner and Kutz Camps, Noam has performed at countless organizational events, summer camps & congregations. We are thrilled to welcome Noam to our community and look forward to hearing his inspiring music and learning from him.
