ECC & RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Each year the first full week of May officially brings a national focus of gratitude directed at educators across the country with an abundance of expressions of appreciation for teachers and what they do. I personally believe that every day of the year should be recognized as Teacher Appreciation Day. We here at Temple Akiba are filled with gratitude for the dedicated, creative, and responsive care that the educators in our classrooms give to our children each and every week. Our teachers in our schools are our honored partners who work on the ground daily and weekly to create inspiring and responsive environments that support the learning of our children. The National Education Association (NEA) describes National Teacher Dav "as a day for honoring teachers and recognizing the lasting contributions they make to our lives."

There is something so Jewish about this idea. Two things that Judaism places the highest value upon are the expression of gratitude and the importance of teaching and learning. The wise rabbi and philosopher, Abraham Jonathan Heschel captured the essence of the power and impact of teachers, especially those of young children, when he said, "What we need, more than anything else, isn't textbooks but rather text people. It is the personality of the teacher which is the text that students read – the text that they'll never forget." Teaching carries quite a weight of responsibility and it's right that we dedicate some energy to showing our appreciation to those who dedicate their lives to educating our children.

So, as we approach this formal week of expressing gratitude to teachers in our lives and in the lives of children, reflect on a teacher who has touched your life or someone in your life in a positive way and take a moment to reach out and express your gratitude to them – now and throughout the year. And, to all our teachers I personally thank you for the tiring, yet very meaningful, impactful work you do each and every day.

Message from Our Rabbinic Intern

Dear Temple Akiba family,

The days between Passover and Shavuot represent journeying, as we mark the time passing from the Exodus to our ancestors' arrival at Mount Sinai for the Revelation of our Torah. This season of transition has allowed me to reflect on the past year, my deep appreciation for this community, and my goals for the future. It is with deep gratitude and a love for Temple Akiba that I share that my role as rabbinic intern will come to a close over the summer.

While I will no longer be present in a formal capacity, I do not plan to disappear and hope to continue to be a part of this community moving forward. So instead of "goodbye," I share these words of Tefilat HaDerech/the Traveler's Prayer, which is traditionally said at the onset of a trip when one leaves city limits. At its core, however, Tefilat HaDerech is a prayer for liminal spaces, in-betweens, and moments of transition. I believe its messages can resonate for all the journeying in our lives –

May it be Your will, our God and God of our ancestors, that we journey toward peace, that our footsteps be guided towards peace, that we are supported in peace, and that we reach our desired destinations for life and peace. May we be protected from harm along the way and may there be blessing in our handiwork. May we be granted peace, kindness, and compassion in your eyes and in the eyes of all who behold us. Blessed are You God, who hears prayer and process.

The Hebrew word shalom, translated repeatedly as "peace," can also mean "wholeness," "completeness," and "fulfillment." I love the repetition of "shalom" because it contains so much depth, and evokes the question: What might it look like for me to journey towards wholeness? What or who guides me in that?

In the realm of guidance, I share a tremendous thank you to the staff and clergy team, Cathy Penso, Helene Jaffa, and Carol Diamond (z''l) for their continuous support and mentorship. To the entire Akiba family, thank you for your commitment to journeying together, to growing, and to questioning, and most of all – for allowing me the privilege of walking alongside you. Thank you for welcoming me into the community and supporting me along my path to the rabbinate. From praying with you on Shabbat, to Bnai Mitzvah ceremonies and lifecycle events, to teaching the incredible students in the

Religious School, to diving deep in Torah study – it has been a joy every step of the way. I appreciate all that I have learned with and from each of you, and will always hold this community in my heart.


