Teaching Gratitude

Last year I began my own professional journey into the world of positive education through generous funding from the Builders of Jewish Education and the Jewish Community Foundation working with the Center for Positive Education. This year we are beginning to weave the themes of positive education into our schools and curriculums. As Thanksgiving approaches we have begun talking about gratitude.

"It's not happy people who are thankful. It's thankful people who are happy." Martin Seligman, psychologist, and educator.

The benefits of gratitude have been shown to include:

• Gratitude increases happiness. Thankfulness leads to heightened well-being and especially positive moods.

• Gratitude creates lasting happiness. An attitude of gratitude helps you not only increase positive emotion but can also sustain it.

• Gratitude protects you from both stress and negativity. Gratitude is associated with decreased anxiety and depression and increased social support.

• Gratitude leads to stronger relationships. Gratitude strengthens your relationships and helps you create and maintain good relationships and feel more connected.

Instilling gratitude in your children at a young age could help them grow up to be happier people.

How do we teach children gratitude? Teaching our children about being grateful is not easy. It's a difficult concept for younger children to understand.

Model gratitude. Say thank you when you mean it and make sure your child knows when you are grateful for something they do too. Children always look to adults to model their own behavior so make sure you practice what you preach.

Perform Acts of Kindness. There are many things your child can do to show appreciation for other people and things. This might involve returning a favor, like loaning a toy to a friend who is kind or making a gift for someone. Make it clear that there are many ways to show people that you're grateful for all they do.

Create a ritual. A simple way to include gratitude in your family's daily life is to talk about it at the dinner table. At dinner each night, have everyone list one thing they loved about their day. This helps children to see that there is always something we can be grateful for.

Encouraging your child to express their gratitude can help

build their resilience and create skills for life. When done together as a family it can also strengthen relationships and build some mindfulness into your day.

I don't know if they did this intentionally, but I feel blessed to have had so many diverse Jewish experience. I attended an orthodox day school, we were members of a conservative Shul, and I spent many summers going to a reform resident camp. I participated in BBYO, USY, NFTY, and NCSY, and I spent many days runner the halls of our local JCC (much to the chagrin of the staff 12). All of these collective experiences created a spark that turned into a flame that paved the way for my life-long Jewish involvement, and has led me to being part of the special team and community here at Temple Akiba.

As we draw closer to the end of the year, two special holidays are approaching – Thanksgiving and Chanukah. Both holidays are different, yet they share a common theme of thankfulness, and for me, include miracles.

Temple Akiba Goes Green - Achieves Sustainability Certification

On June 1, Temple Akiba, along with 12 other newly certified members of the Culver City business community, was recognized at a ceremony held at the Temple as part of the City's Sustainable Business Certification Program. To be certified, Akiba was guided through a comprehensive on-site sustainability assessment of our building and operations and, with a City sustainability consultant's help, developed measures to increase energy and water efficiencies, establish green purchasing and create a better environment for our community. To quote the Culver City's mayor, Dr. Daniel Lee, "The Sustainable Business Certification Program is helping Culver City reduce its carbon footprint and improve the wellbeing of workers, customers and the entire community" which, in our case, translates as clergy, staff, congregants, and children. Since the inception of this program, 58 certified businesses reduced their annual Greenhouse Gas Emissions by 246 metric tons, decreased their water use by 4.6 million gallons, and saved 343,00 kWh of electricity.

Thanks to the Temple Green Team, Rebecca Holzberg and importantly to Jeffrey Rips and his unflagging leadership, Akiba has achieved Sustainability Certification and received two grants, one for installation of a water bottle station and one for installation of LED lighting in the annex.




