

ECC & RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

This holiday season it is more important than ever to help our children focus on gratitude. Gratitude not only helps people form, maintain, and strengthen supportive relationships, but it also helps people feel connected to a caring community. The current pandemic provides the perfect opportunity to foster gratitude within in our children and ideal at home activities families can do together to express gratitude.



Start by modeling and teaching gratitude

Our children want to be like us. We provide the blueprint for what to say and what to do and in what contexts. Expressing gratitude through words, writing, and small gifts or acts of reciprocity are all ways to teach children how to become grateful. Doing this will help make your appreciation for the goodness in your life more public, showing your kids that blessings abound and that being thankful is a valued attitude.

Practice Gratitude Exercises

Gratitude initiates an "upward spiral of positive emotions." Research shows that expressing gratitude increases your happiness by helping you notice the good things that are already happening.

- Gratitude Visit write & deliver a letter of gratitude (call, text, or if possible, visit)
- Counting Blessings 3 good things that happened to me are... and why?
- Gratitude Jar An Overflowing glass Create your own gratitude well. List everything and everyone you are grateful for. Write each item on a separate small piece of paper. Roll each one up like a scroll and place it in a glass in your bedroom or in a prominent place in your home. When you have a rough day or are feeling anxious, go to your well of positive emotions, and read some of the scrolls to help you regain good feelings, & restore your feelings of gratitude.
- Gratitude Walk Designate a time for a gratitude walk- decide which people, things, or events you are thankful for. This can take place any time, any place, inside or outside!
- Gratitude Journal Write down 3-5 things you are grateful for and illustrate it! "I have so much to be thankful for"
- Acts of Loving Kindness What can you do for someone else?
- Send someone a message reminding them that you care about them, and how important they are to you.
- o If you are going to the store, offer to pick something up for someone in guarantine.
- o Be generous with your emails/text messages/phone calls

Trying to make grateful kids isn't just an issue for families; it's an issue for society as well. Society desperately needs to harness the power of gratitude. We must all do our part to help kids develop into moral adults, who will contribute to a world of compassion and care. By bringing out the best in our kids, we can only imagine what blessings Generation Grateful could bring. Anything worthwhile takes a lot of time and effort. It's up to all of us to make it happen.





Happy Hanukkah

This year, we kindle the first candle of Hanukkah on Thursday night, December 10th and the last candle on Thursday night, December 17th.

Candles are added to the Hanukkiah from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. (On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.) Light the Shamash - the helper candle set higher or lower than all the rest of the candles - first using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights; say or sing:

Baruch atah, Adonai, Eloheinu Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

Baruch atah, Adonai, Eloheinu Melech haolam, she-asah nisim la'avoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim haheim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wonderous deeds for our ancestors in days of old, at this season.

On the First Night only we add:

Baruch atah, Adonai, Eloheinu Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higianu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, for giving us life, for sustaining us, and for enabling us to reach this season.
